Project Update Stollery Children's Hospital Critical Care Program



Overview

- The 2017-2021 Capital Plan allocated \$65.7 million over the next four years for the redevelopment and expansion of the Critical Care Program at the Stollery Children's Hospital.
- This project will increase clinical support space to accommodate new equipment that is needed to meet increasing levels of patient acuity and will meet current health standards of practice.
- The project will provide a world class facility that will increase capacity and meet current and future patient at the Stollery Children's Hospital's Critical Care Units.
- This project consists of the following phases:
 - (Phase 1): Develop the currently shelled space on the sixth floor of the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute for a Pediatric Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit (completed late 2017);
 - (Phase 2): Expand the existing Pediatric Intensive Care Unit, by redesigning and redeveloping the former Adult Cardio Vascular Intensive Care/Surgery Unit at the Walter Mackenzie Health Sciences Centre;
 - (Phase 3): Redevelop the existing Stollery Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and Pediatric Intensive Care Unit areas and provide space for commonclinical/family support;

 Complete renovations on the existing double isolation room at the Stollery Neo-Natal Intensive Care Unit that is located at the Royal Alexandra Hospital (to create two single isolation rooms) (completed in 2016).

Construction Update

- Construction was completed on Phase 1 of the Pediatric Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit on the 6th floor of the Mazankowski Heart Institute and turned over to Alberta Health Services in October 2017.
- Procurement tenders for Phases 2 and 3 were closed for the main scope of work such as mechanical, electrical and drywalling.
- Phase 2 is started with demolition activities in January 2018.

Next Steps and Upcoming Activities

- Completion of the tender awards for Phases 2 and 3.
- Construction on Phase 2.
