

Project Update

Stollery Children's Hospital Critical Care Program



Overview

- The 2018 Capital Plan allocated \$44 million over the next four years for the redevelopment and expansion of the Critical Care Program at the Stollery Children's Hospital.
- This project will increase clinical support space to accommodate new equipment that is needed to meet increasing levels of patient acuity and will meet current health standards of practice.
- The project will provide a world class facility that will increase capacity and meet current and future patients at the Stollery Children's Hospital's Critical Care Units.
- This project consists of the following phases:
 - Complete renovations on the existing double isolation room at the Stollery Neonatal Intensive Care Unit that is located at the Royal Alexandra Hospital (to create two single isolation rooms) (completed in 2016).
 - (Phase 1): Develop the currently shelled space on the sixth floor of the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute for a Pediatric Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit (completed late 2017);
 - (Phase 2): Expand the existing Pediatric Intensive Care Unit, by redesigning and redeveloping the former Adult Cardio Vascular Intensive Care/Surgery Unit at the Walter Mackenzie Health Sciences Centre (currently in progress);

- (Phase 3): Redevelop the existing Stollery Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and Pediatric Intensive Care Unit areas and provide space for common-clinical/family support.

Construction Update

- Construction was completed on Phase 1 of the Pediatric Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit on the 6th floor of the Mazankowski Heart Institute and turned over to Alberta Health Services in October 2017.
- Procurement tenders for Phases 2 and 3 were completed.
- Phase 2 was started in January 2018, demolition and abatement activities are ongoing.

Next Steps and Upcoming Activities

- Construction on Phase 2 is expected to be completed by early 2019.
