

# Project Update

## Lethbridge Chinook Regional Hospital



### Overview

- In this year's Capital Plan, the province has allocated almost \$6 million for the completion of the project over the next two years.
- The Lethbridge Chinook Regional Hospital project is comprised of three phases:
  - Renovation to day procedures area, including expansion to vacated cancer clinic (**completed July 2013**);
  - New wing expansion of approximately 19,000 square metres (**completed October 2015**); and
  - Renovations to the emergency department and cancer clinic (underway).
- The Chinook Regional Hospital redevelopment provided improved access to outpatient services, specialized care and emergency services.
- The redevelopment included a five-storey addition of approximately 19,000 square metres.
- The top two levels of the new addition include roughed-in space for future development/expansion.
- Approximately 3,500 square metres of space is being renovated in other parts of the existing health centre.

## Construction Update

### Renovated Impacted Departments and Cancer Clinic

- Rehabilitation department was turned over to Alberta Health Services (AHS) in September 2016.
- Labour & Delivery department was turned over to AHS in November 2016.
- Phase 1 - (Pharmacy) of the cancer centre was completed and turned over to AHS in February 2017.
- Phase 2 - at the Jack Ady Cancer Centre (JACC) was completed and turned over to AHS in July 2017 .
- Phase 3 - construction and demolition is underway at the JACC.

### Next Steps and Upcoming Activities

- The cancer centre renovation and expansion work is anticipated to be complete in December 2017.
