

Project Update

Stollery Children's Hospital Critical Care Program



Overview

- The 2017-2021 Capital Plan allocates \$53 million over the next four years for the Critical Care Program at the Stollery Children's Hospital.
- This project is required to increase clinical support space that will meet current standards of practice and accommodate equipment associated with increasing levels of patient acuity.
- The project will provide a world class facility that meets both current and future patient needs through increased capacity of the Stollery Children's Hospital's Critical Care Units.
- This project consists of the following phases:
 - (Phase 1): Develop the currently shelled space on the sixth floor of the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute for a Pediatric Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit;
 - (Phase 2): Expand the existing a Pediatric Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit, by redesigning and redeveloping the former Adult Cardio Vascular Intensive Care/Surgery Unit at the Walter Mackenzie Health Sciences Centre;
 - (Phase 3): Redevelop the existing Stollery Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and Pediatric Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit areas and provide space for common non-clinical/family support;
 - Complete renovations on the existing double isolation room at the Stollery NICU located at the Royal Alexandra Hospital to create two single isolation rooms.

Construction Update

- Construction continues on Phase 1 of the Pediatric Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit on the 6th floor of the Mazankowski Heart Institute. Phase 1 is scheduled to be completed and turned over to AHS in late 2017.
- Phase 1 construction is approximately 70% complete.
- The Royal Alexandra Hospital isolation room renovation was completed and turned over to AHS in July 2016.

Next Steps and Upcoming Activities

- Complete Phase 1 construction.
- Tenders will be issued in fall 2017 for areas such as mechanical, electrical and drywalling for Phases 2 and 3.
