

Project Update

Stollery Children's Hospital Critical Care Program



Overview

- The 2018 Capital Plan allocated \$44 million over the next four years for the redevelopment and expansion of the Critical Care Program at the Stollery Children's Hospital.
- This project will increase clinical support space to accommodate new equipment that is needed to meet increasing levels of patient care and current health standards of practice.
- When the project is completed, Alberta will have a world class facility that will increase capacity and meet current and future patients needs at the Stollery Children's Hospitals Critical Care Units.
- This project consists of the following phases:
 - Renovations on the existing double isolation room at the Stollery Neonatal Intensive Care Unit that is located at the Royal Alexandra Hospital (will create two single isolation rooms) (completed in 2016).

- (Phase 1): Develop the currently shelled space on the sixth floor of the Mazankowski Alberta Heart Institute for a Pediatric Cardiovascular Intensive Care Unit (completed late 2017);
- (Phase 2): Expand the existing Pediatric Intensive Care Unit, by redesigning and redeveloping the former Adult Cardio Vascular Intensive Care/Surgery Unit at the Walter Mackenzie Health Sciences Centre (currently in progress); and
- (Phase 3): Redevelop the existing Stollery Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and Pediatric Intensive Care Unit areas and provide space for common clinical/family support.

Construction Update

- Construction on Phase 2 is progressing with electrical, mechanical and headwalls installation.
- Floor installation and wall protection are underway.
- Installation, demolition re-routing of mechanical and electrical systems is in progress at interstitial level (unoccupied floors).

- Construction on Phase 2 is expected to be completed by the spring of 2019.
- Construction on Phase 3 is anticipated to get underway in the summer 2019.
